

- Personal reviews

- Find out what you like doing or want to change
- ► Track your success
- Help prepare for interviews
- ► Help deal with challenges
- ► Identify gaps in knowledge

- Find mentors
- Learn about other careers/specialties
- Learn more about industry/sectors
- Connect with people more senior than you
- Connect with people more junior than you
- Any other benefits?

Power

- Your physical presence and your online presence are interwoven and there is no separation. This is where you can build you personal brand




Consider Your Existing Network

- LinkedIn also has a **feature** that allows your existing connections to introduce you to their connections




My Network Mind Map

- ► A LinkedIn **profile isn't a CV** but it needs similar time and attention.
- Join LinkedIn groups/Other online communities

Join an online community



- Social media groups and chats
- LinkedIn Groups including Equate's
- Professional Forums
- Free training and webinars (Equate)
- Stuff that matters podcast Equate

Move Beyond LinkedIn



- Contribute to the social networking community
- ► **Timing** is everything
- Don't overshare
- Personal vs professional accounts

Connect the right way

- Make meaningful connections
- Contact people for specific reasons
- Share, Connect & Nurture Relationships
- ► Send a 'snail mail'
- Do this through: Chat/groups on LinkedIn and Twitter or their professional email



Informational Interviews

- ► Your network can help you find people to speak to.
- ► People want to help
- ► Be **explicit** about what you would like from the interview



Informational Interviews

- 1. Technical questions: 'Duties of the role' 'Similar job titles' 'What learning is 'necessary' and what is 'nice to have'. What are the experiential experiences they are looking for? 'What keywords are recruiters looking for?" "what fields does this role work in?"
- 2. Organisational questions: "How does the company treat people regarding duties/pay/opportunities?" "How does the company feel about flexible working?" "What are the demands/frustrations?" "Where are opportunities advertised?"
- **3. Personal Questions**: "What did you wish you knew when you started?" "What do you find most satisfying?" "What is most dissatisfying about he work?" "how would you describe the culture?"
