INTRODUCTION TO AUTOMOTIVE REFINISHING

Course Outline

This vocational course is designed to engage and motivate those who are interested in learning about the automotive Refinishing industry. This course requires vou to complete an eportfolio to record the knowledge and skills attained. This can be completed on a mobile smart phone, tablet, or laptop. You will also have access to eLearning course material allowing for study anywhere, anytime. Access to laptop/smart device and Wi-Fi would be advantageous. The Motor Vehicle industry continues to see truly inspiring developments, exciting change and sustainable growth in both personal and public transportation. It is an excellent place to build a secure future and already employs more than 800,000 people in the UK

Entry Level Recommended

A genuine interest in vehicles and how to refinish them is a must. SCQF level 4 qualifications would be an advantage.

COMPUTER GAMES DEVELOPMENT

Course Outline

Do you have a passion for computer games? Do you want to learn to how to design and make a game?

The course introduces you to the development process behind computer games.

You will have the opportunity to gain a valuable insight into some of the technologies and skills required within the computer games industry.

Entry Level Recommended

There are no formal entry requirements, but a keen interest in computing is expected.

Course Content

You will gain two units in

Games Design: What makes a game engaging or immersive?

You will be guided through the design process analysing existing titles to consider why they have become so popular. You will move onto develop your own creative skills working on design projects and game pitches

- Level Design: You will gain hands on experience in 3D level design and construction features in unreal (or similar) technologies with state of the art equipment.
- Introduction to computer programming for games: this is where the magic happens. Learn how to code your own computer games using programming software.

Progression

You can progress to the SCQF level 5 Computer Games at college, or a Foundation Apprenticeship IT Software.

The games industry is currently booming and previous students have gone on to work for companies such as Rockstar and Cloud Imperium.

INTRODUCTION TO PHARMACY

Course Outline

The course aims to provide you with experience of the following key areas of pharmacy services:

- Understanding Disease States & Promoting Public Health
- Preparation & Use of Medicines
- Medical Terms

You will study structure & function of the human body and link this knowledge to a range of public health issues including coronary heart disease and diabetes. Practical work will allow you to develop skills in aseptic preparation of medicines and good dispensing practice.

You will be assessed by written tests and also in practical skills.

Entry Level Recommended

You should be studying science subjects at Nat 5 and have a keen interest in a career working in the pharmacy sector.

Course Content

- Health Sector: Improving Heath & Wellbeing (SCQF Level 5: 1.0 credits)
- Applying Practical Skills (SCQF Level 5: 1.0 credits)

Progression

In combination with relevant school qualifications this course could lead to the full time Access to Pharmacy Services programme (SCQF Level 5).

MEDICAL LABORATORY SKILLS

S4 RSL CERTIFICATE LIVE MUSIC PERFORMANCE

Course Outline

This course will provide you with the opportunity to improve your skills as a musician by providing you with individual instrumental tuition and perform in a band as part of live performance.

Entry Level Recommended

A basic ability on one of the following instruments is required – Guitar, Bsss Guitar, Drums, Keyboards, Vocals.

Course Content

The course will consist of two main elements – instrumental tuition and live performance.

For instrumental tuition, you will study your specialist instrument at a particular grade (1-8) with world renowned awarding bodies RSL and Trinity. At the end of the year, you will have the opportunity to sit the exam and become qualified on your instrument at a grade that suits your current ability. For live performance, you will work in our state-of-the-art rehearsal facilities with other musicians in your class as a band, learning how to prepare for a professional live performance, culminating in a live music

performance at a local venue. In previous years, our students have performed their end of year showcases in venues such as The Beacon Arts Centre.

Progression

This course can lead to progression on to NC Music or NPA Music in S5, which in turn can then lead to a course in higher education such as HNC/HND Music, and year one of university courses

Interview

The interview will consist of an informal audition with one of our instrument tutors. You should prepare 2 pieces to perform on your instrument.

SOUND PRODUCTION

Course Outline

You will be introduced to the skills required to work as a recording studio engineer and live sound engineer. These two main areas of employment in the sound production industry will enable you to learn skills in multi-track recording and multitrack mixing, learning to use industry standard DAW software Pro Tools and Reason. You will also learn how to set up a PA system and how to operate live sound at live events.

Entry Level Recommended

No formal entry requirements.

Course Content

The three SQA units (three credits) that will make up this course are as follows:

- Multi-track recording and mixing
- Digital Audio Workstations -Pro Tools and Reason
- Setting up a PA system
- Operating Live Sound

Progression

Successful students will have the opportunity to progress to SCQF Level 5/6 qualifications, such as NC Sound Production.

You will also learn how to professionally use and care for knifes within professional kitchens.

Frequently Asked Questions

How do I get there?

Your school will organise transport to take you to the college, and take you back to the nearest point to your home at the end of the day.

How are the vocational course options different from the subjects that I take at school?

The main difference is that with vocational course options there is a strong focus on building skills for life and skills for work. The vocational courses lead to awards such as Scottish Vocational Qualifications (SVQs), City and Guilds (C&G) and Higher National Certificates HNC.

How will the courses be certified?

When you receive your certificate from the Scottish Qualifications Authority (SQA) and City and Guilds, the results of your vocational courses will appear alongside the awards for courses you have completed in school.

So what are the benefits?

The award itself will act as a springboard for you to gain direct entry into the workplace, or into a traineeship or apprenticeship, or to go on to college or university. You will develop valuable skills such as working with others and problem solving, skills that you will need if you are to succeed in the world of work.
