IMI AWARD INTRODUCTION TO MOTOR VEHICLE INDUSTRY AND TECHNOLOGIES

This National Progression Award (NPA) is designed to introduce you - at SCQF Level 5 - to a selection of topics and areas of debates that inform contemporary ideas of crime and justice.

You should have Nat 5 English and have a keen interest in the subject.

This is a creative subject with a technical element, but no previous experience is required. There are lots of ways to contribute to projects that are not obviously 'creative' and you'll practise a wide range of skills to produce a portfolio and take part in practical activities. Because you'll be working across subjects, this course will help you decide if you want a career spanning a range of sectors or if you want to specialise in one.

Entry Level Recommended

A Personal statement is required, and entry levels require to be met.

Entry is at the discretion of the College.

ACTIVITY TOURISM WITH EVENT ORGANISATION

Course Outline

NPA APPLIED SCIENCE INCORPORATING FORENSICS

Course Outline

On this course you will study Chemistry, Physics, Biology and Forensic Science at National 5 level. Topics will include waves and radiation, the periodic table, forensic profiling and osmosis and diffusion. Practical skills will be developed on the course as well as becoming confident in analysing data. You will gain experience working with scientific equipment and develop lab safety skills, working in a lab setting.

Entry Level Recommended

Entry is at the discretion of the College. You should be working at National 5 level and be studying 1 National 5 Science subject and National 5 Maths.

Course Content

You will have the opportunity to work on projects related to forensic science, chemistry, biology and physics, safely in a lab setting.

HUMAN BODY STRUCTURE AND FUNCTION

Course Outline

Human Body Structure and Function SCQF Level 8 units offers you the opportunity to extend your knowledge and develop an understanding of selected body systems and how the human body co-ordinates these systems to maintain homeostasis. In studying these systems, you will also discover what happens when things go wrong, covering conditions as diverse as hyperthyroidism, gigantism and coronary heart disease.

Entry Level Recommended

- Open to S6 Pupils
- You must have achieved **Biology or Human Biology Higher** or be working towards **Advanced Higher**
- You should have a genuine interest in **human anatomy & physiology**

Course Content

This course covers topics including:

- Structure & function of the skeletal system
- Function of the blood and heart
- Structure and function of respiratory system
- Structure and function of urinary system
- Structure and function of digestive system
- Hormonal and electrical signalling
- Practical laboratory experiments

*Please note you will be studying an SQA double credit unit at SCQF level 8, this is not a Group Award.

Progression

The unit is an ideal progression route to university programmes in medicine and dentistry, as well as to biology based degrees. Data handling, problem solving, and experimental techniques are all developed alongside expanding knowledge on anatomy and physiology.
