IMI LEVEL 1 AWARD IN VEHICLE ACCIDENT REPAIR

Course Outline

This Vocationally Related course is designed to engage and motivate 15-19-year-olds who are interested in learning about the automotive accident and repair industry. This course requires the learner to complete an eportfolio to record the knowledge and skills attained and pass an online knowledge assessment. Course work can be completed on a mobile smart phone, tablet, laptop etc. Access to laptop/smart device and Wi-Fi would be advantageous. The Motor vehicle industry continues to see truly inspiring developments, exciting change and sustainable growth in both personal and public transportation. It is an excellent place to build a secure future and already employs more than 800,000 people in the UK.

Entry Level Recommended

There are no formal entry level requirements for this qualification, However, selection will consider each applicants existing qualifications, experience and interest in working in the sector.

Course Content

Get set to master a diverse range of fundamental skills to progress in the thriving motor industry. From essential units in Health and Safety to covering the range of tools and equipment in the accident and repair industry you will gain the basic knowledge to kick start your automotive career. You will also cover engaging topics in the workshop such as remove and replace vehicle body panels and repair of damaged panels.

The assessment of this qualification is made up of 2 components: IMI Combined written and practical assessments and IMI Online test.

Progression

This course is an excellent starting point if you are considering full time college including progression route with West to study Level 2 Diploma in Vehicle Body repair or Level 2 Diploma in Vehicle Accident Repair Paint principles.

Level Design: You will gain hands on experience in 3D level design and construction features in unreal (or similar) technologies with state of the art equipment.

Introduction to computer programming for games: This is where the magic happens. Learn how to code your own computer games using programming software.

Progression

On completion you could progress to further study at college but in the future, you could be working at one of the leading studios in Scotland as a Games Designer or Programmer. Turn your passion for gaming into an exciting career!

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SKILLS FOR WORK EARLY LEARNING AND CHILDCARE LEVEL 4

Course Outline

If you continue into S5, you will be able to apply for the Skills for Work Level 5 Early Education and Childcare course. This will further develop your knowledge of childcare. Alternatively, you can apply for a full-time Level 5 course Entry to Early Education and Childcare.

CONSTRUCTION – SELECTION OF NAT 4 UNITS

Course Outline

Scotland's construction sector is so important to the nation's economy with jobs in the industry ever in demand, employing nearly a quarter of a million people in Scotland and contributing billions to its economy. The construction industry also plays a key role in achieving the Scottish Government's ambitious housing, energy, and climate change targets.

This course is an ideal starting point for you to explore each of the main trade areas. This is a very practical course where you will work in a variety of workshops. You will cover trade areas as well as underpinning theoretical work. Alongside learning new skills, you will also work towards developing core skills such as communications, numeracy, working with others and problem solving all of which are invaluable when entering the world of work.

Entry Level Recommended

There are no formal entry requirements for this course.

Course Content

In this course, you'll have the opportunity to get started in the basics of construction. This could cover carpentry and joinery, brickwork or painting and decorating. You'll acquire a range of practical skills and unleash your creative potential in the field of construction.

Progression

On completion of this course, you can progress onto senior phase Construction Crafts. Graduates from West have gone on to a range of trade roles including plumbers, electricians, joiners, painting and decorators and more.

ENGINEERING

Course Outline

Scotland's engineering and advanced manufacturing sector contributes £9 billion a year to the nation's economy. Careers in Engineering are on the rise and these jobs represent an exciting opportunity for young people in Scotland.

This course is a great qualification to introduce you to the Engineering sector. It will equip you with an invaluable set of transferable engineering skills that will allow you to access a host of industries from mechanical to maintenance and electrical to fabrication, giving you all the basics to get started in the ever-growing engineering sector.

Entry Level Recommended

There are no formal entry requirements.

Course Content

The course is comprised of three units at National 4 level, and they are designed to substantially improve your practical and theoretical skills:

- ◆ **Plumbing**
- ◆ **Mechanical Engineering**
- ◆ **Electrical/Electronic Engineering**

Progression

You can progress onto the National 5 Engineering course, or Foundation Apprenticeship Engineering. Longer term you could be working in a diverse range of sectors in the engineering industry including design, mechanical, maintenance, electrical, electronics, fabrication and manufacture.

ROCK SCHOOL LIVE PERFORMANCE

Course Outline

This course will provide you with the opportunity to improve your skills as a musician by providing you with individual instrumental tuition and perform in a band as part of live performance.

Entry Level Recommended

A basic ability on one of the following instruments is required – Guitar, Bass Guitar, Drums, Keyboards, Vocals.

Course Content

The course will consist of two main elements – instrumental tuition and live performance.

For instrumental tuition, you will study your specialist instrument at a particular grade (1-8) with world renowned awarding bodies RSL and Trinity. At the end of the year, you will have the opportunity to sit the exam and become qualified on your instrument at a grade that suits your current ability.

For live performance, you will work in our state-of-the-art rehearsal facilities with other musicians in your class as a band, learning how to prepare for a professional live performance, culminating in a live music performance at a local venue. In previous years, our students have performed their end of year showcases in venues such as The Beacon Arts Centre.

Progression

This course can lead to progression on to NC Music or NPA Music in S5, which in turn can then lead to a course in higher education such as HNC/HND Music, and year one of university courses.

Interview

The interview will consist of an informal audition with one of our instrument tutors. You should prepare 2 pieces to perform on your instrument.

This course is designed for those with an interest in working full or part time in this vibrant, fast paced and exciting industry. From a café, coffee shop, licenced restaurant or hotel, this combination of industry required certificates and skills added to your CV will help you find employment.

On this course you will develop knowledge an understanding of personal hygiene, food safety and health and safety requirements when working in a professional kitchen along with organisational and time management skills required to follow recipes and produce dishes. You will also learn how to professionally use and care for knives within professional kitchens.

Entry Level Recommended

No entry requirements, however, a keen interest in cooking is desired.

Course Content

Get started with the basics of food preparation techniques and ensure your dishes are not only delicious but also safely prepared with a unit covering food hygiene for the hospitality industry, where you'll learn the ins and outs of maintaining impeccable cleanliness in the kitchen. Our unit covering an introduction to cookery processes will uncover the secrets behind cooking techniques that elevate your dishes to gourmet status!

Progression

Choose from college courses like NPA Bakery or NC Professional Cookery to further your studies. Ultimately you could pursue a fast-paced career in the culinary world, becoming a chef! FORENSIC SCIENCE

Course Outline

This course could be of interest to those looking to work in various fields of forensics, including Scenes of Crime Officers as well as lab-based Forensic Scientists. Here you'll learn more about these different roles whilst gaining knowledge and experience of the laboratory techniques used in forensic analysis.

Entry Level Recommended

At the start of this course you must have a minimum of a Nat 5 science subject OR be working towards a Nat 5 science subject.

Course Content

The course is made up of the 3 units/topics shown here and assessment of college subjects is through a series of short tests rather than a final exam. This course also involves various research tasks where you must produce written reports.

Successful completion of the course awards the following SQA units:

- Forensic Science (1 credit)
- Forensic Anthropology (1 credit)
- Criminology: Crime Scenes (1 credit)

Progression

In combination with other school qualifications, successful completion of this course could allow entry to more advanced college programmes such as Access to HN Science (Level 6) or HNC Applied Science (Level 7).

For those with fewer science -based qualifications, progression to NQ Applied Science Level 5 or the Pre-Apprenticeship in Pharmacy Services (Level 5) would be possible.

HEALTH SCIENCE

Course Outline

This course looks to develop your knowledge and understanding of a range of subjects relevant to health-related careers. Here you'll not only expand your knowledge of health sciences, but you'll also develop good laboratory skills.

Entry Level Recommended

At the start of this course you must have a minimum of Nat 5 Biology OR be working towards Nat 5 Biology.

Course Content

The course is made up of the 4 units/topics shown here and assessment of college subjects is through a series of short tests rather than a final exam.

Successful completion of the course awards the following SQA units:

- Health & Technology (1.0 credit)
- Medical Devices & Pharmaceuticals (1.0 credit)
- Introduction to Pharmacology (0.5 credit)
- Practical Skills (0.5 credit)

Progression

This course would support those looking to pursue careers in health related areas such as medicine, dentistry, nursing, pharmacy and veterinary medicine, as well as those with an interest in any biological science based college programme. For example, this could allow entry to either NQ Applied Science Level 5 or the Pre-Apprenticeship in Pharmacy Services (Level 5), or in combination with other school qualifications, entry to Access to HN Science (Level 6) or HNC Applied Science (Level 7).

How do I get there?

If transport is required, this is organised through your school and will take you back to the nearest point to your home at the end of the day.

How are the vocational course options different from the subjects that I take at school?

The main difference is that with vocational course options there is a strong focus on building skills for life and skills for work. The vocational courses lead to awards such as Scottish Vocational Qualifications (SVQs), City and Guilds (C&G) and Higher National Certificates HNC.

How will the courses be certified?

When you receive your certificate from the Scottish Qualifications Authority (SQA) and City and Guilds, the results of your vocational courses will appear alongside the awards for courses you have completed in school.

So what are the benefits?

Whether your next step is into the workplace, starting on your apprenticeship journey, or progressing to further study at college or university, this qualification will help you make that next big move. As well as your qualification, you'll gain essential skills like communication, teamwork, and problem-solving—tools that will set you apart and help you excel in the dynamic world of work. You'll also get the chance to experience learning outside the school classroom, getting a taste for college life and a different style of learning from our award-winning lecturing team..
