The Role of the Board of Management

The Board of Management has collective responsibility for setting the strategic direction of the College and ensuring successful delivery of our Mission, Vision and Strategic Plan.

In line with the Strategic Plan 2026–2030, the Board:

- Provides purpose driven leadership grounded in public value and community impact.
- Places learners, staff and communities at the centre of decision making.
- Ensures effective governance, financial stewardship and risk management.
- Champions equality, diversity, inclusion and wellbeing.
- Strengthens partnerships with employers, communities, government and the wider tertiary system.
- Holds the Executive Team to account for delivery against agreed priorities and outcomes.

Skills and Experience Sought

We are seeking individuals who can help guide the College through a period of opportunity and challenge, supporting delivery of our Strategic Plan and long term sustainability.

We particularly welcome skills and experience that support:

The Role of a Board Member

As a Board Member, your role is to contribute to collective leadership that enables West College Scotland to deliver transformational impact.

Working collaboratively with fellow Board members and the Executive Team, you will:

- Provide strategic oversight aligned to the College's four strategic themes: Our People, Our Partnerships, Our Place and Our Performance.
- Offer constructive challenge and informed advice that supports innovation, agility and continuous improvement.
- Champion equality, diversity and inclusion, ensuring opportunities to thrive are accessible to all.
- Act as an ambassador for the College, building trust and confidence with learners, staff, partners and stakeholders.
- Uphold the highest standards of governance, integrity and public accountability.

All Board Members share collective responsibility; no individual member has authority to act independently of the Board.

The Board comprises up to 20 members as follows:

- The Chair, appointed by the Scottish Minister.
- The Principal.
- 2 members of staff elected to the Board (1 from the Teaching staff and 1 from the Support staff).
- 2 students nominated by the Students Association.
- 2 staff members nominated by the local Trade Unions (1 from Teaching staff and 1 from the Support Staff).
- Up to 12 Non-Executive members, appointed through a recruitment and interview process and approved by the Scottish Minister.

Fit and Proper Person Test

Scottish Ministers and the public must feel confident that people appointed to Board of public bodies are fit and proper persons to take up these positions. In the context of board member appointments, a Fit and Proper Person is an individual who is suitable for appointment because they meet the requirements of the role, and their past or present activities and/or behaviours mean that they are suitable for appointment.

Time Commitment and Term of Appointment

The Board meets a minimum of four times per year, with additional committee and development activity.

The expected time commitment is approximately 12 days per annum. In addition, Board members are encouraged to attend graduations to celebrate students' successes; and student shows and events which showcase their achievements. They are similarly invited to staff events, such as Staff Awards and departmental visits.

Appointments are typically made for up to four years, with the possibility of a single re appointment, subject to performance and Ministerial approval.

Board member roles are unremunerated. Reasonable expenses incurred in the course of Board duties will be reimbursed, subject to the College's policies.

APPLICATION AND ASSESSMENT INFORMATION

Please read these notes carefully before you apply.

1. Your Application

The information in your application is important in determining whether you will proceed through the assessment stages conducted by the selection panel.

All Board members need to have skills and personal qualities which will enable them to make a good contribution to the Board, but these do not have to have been gained by working at a management post or at a senior/strategic level. You may have gained these skills through being active in your community, in a voluntary capacity or through your personal experience. We are looking for people with enquiring minds and who can communicate ideas and thoughts to others.

The Board is particularly keen to welcome applications from people local to our main campuses, although it is not essential that you live/work in areas where our campuses are based.

Applicants are asked to submit:

- ▶ A covering letter outlining motivation and alignment with the role of no more than 1500 words.
- ▶ The completed application form demonstrating relevant skills and experience of no more than 300 words per criteria.
- ▶ The Self Declaration form and Equal Opportunities monitoring form.

Appointments are made following a transparent, regulated public appointments process and are subject to appropriate vetting.

2. Selection Panel Evaluation

The Selection Panel must provide enough information and evidence to Scottish Ministers to enable them to feel confident that the person they are appointing to the Board of the public body is suitable to take up the appointment. Please see section on Fit and Proper Person test above.

The panel will seek evidence provided by you that: you have the skills, knowledge and experience required for the role.

- ▶ You understand the work of the College and the nature of the appointment and that you are not aware of having committed any offence or performed any act incompatible with the position that you are applying for.
- ▶ You can give the time required for the role.
- ▶ You are not disqualified on any grounds from being appointed to this Board may be sought at interview, may be sought at interview.

By virtue of submitting an application you are declaring that the information provided is, to the best of your knowledge and belief, true and complete.

If appointed to the Board, you will be asked to sign your agreement to abide by terms and conditions set out in the letter of appointment, which includes agreeing to abide by the College's Code of Conduct.

3. Valuing Equality and Diversity

West College Scotland is committed to diversity and equality. We value the benefits of having different points of view and experiences represented on the Board. WCS is an Equal Opportunities Employer and applicants must embrace equality and diversity. You are requested, therefore, to complete and return the Equal Opportunities Monitoring Information form (Appendix A) with your application.

We are keen to encourage applications from groups currently under-represented on Scotland's public bodies, such as women, people with a disability, people aged under 50, and black, Asian, and ethnic minority applicants. As a Disability Confident organisation, we offer a guaranteed interview scheme for applicants who have declared a disability and who meet the essential requirements of the role.

4. How we will handle your application

The panel will invite to interview those applicants who meet the criteria. Applicants invited to interview will be advised of the membership of the Selection Panel in their invitation letter and will be asked to declare if and how they know any of the Panel.

Applicants not selected for the interview stage will be advised of the outcome of their applications in writing (normally via email).

If invited to the interview stage and you have a disability, it will be at this point that you should let us know (contact details will be provided in your invitation to next stage) if you would like particular arrangements made.

The Board of Management will then appoint successful applicants following approval from the Scottish Ministers. This process can normally take a minimum of 4-5 weeks. If you are successful, you will be invited in writing to accept the appointment.

We will comply with the General Data Protection Regulations and will not retain your personal data any longer than is necessary for the completion of this appointment process. Any statistical data retained will be anonymised.

6. Interviews/Expenses

Applicants can claim for reasonable expenses incurred in attending for interview, including dependent carer expenses. It is expected that the most efficient and economic means of travel will be used, and reimbursement will normally be restricted to that amount.

7. Vetting

Appointments are subject to satisfactory vetting. The Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974 (Exclusions and Exceptions) (Scotland) Order 2003 (as amended) applies to roles where there may be substantial contact with young or vulnerable people. Through appointment to West College Scotland Board of Management, you will be required to complete a Protection of Vulnerable Groups (PVG) Scheme application before taking up your appointment.

8. Assessment Criteria - Evidence Sought

Applicants must be able to demonstrate that they are able to meet all the Essential Skills and Experience below.

Essential Skills & Experience

- ▶ Analytical – ability to analyse complex material and to reach sound conclusions.
- ▶ Questioning – ability to question constructively within a team environment.
- ▶ Communication – ability to communicate effectively with a diverse range of stakeholders and build effective networks.
- ▶ Strategic Thinking – ability to contribute to the development of the Board's strategic thinking.
- ▶ Education Landscape – an interest in education and understanding of current issues in Scotland.
- ▶ Corporate Governance - an understanding of corporate governance in public, private or charity sectors and of risk management (prior Board experience is not required).

Desirable

- ▶ Public Service Reform – an understanding of the current Scottish Government's policy ambitions for public services in general and post-16 education in particular.
- ▶ Context – an understanding of the needs of the economy, employers, communities and learners and the challenges of a political environment, at a national and regional level.
